

# Teaching Assistant Position (25% FTE) Winter Quarter 2025

A Teaching Assistant (TA) is needed in the Child, Family and Population Health Nursing Department for NSG 570: Management of Substance Use Disorders and Other Addictions. The TA will play a pivotal role in the administration and coordination of the course evaluation process for this online asynchronous course. This role also supports student engagement and ensures smooth course delivery, with a strong focus on gathering and analyzing feedback to improve and expand the course.

### Roles and Responsibilities of the TA include:

#### Course Evaluation Administration

- Coordinate the dissemination of course evaluation materials
- Promote strong student participation in the evaluation process through consistent reminders and support
- Compile, analyze, and summarize evaluation data to provide actionable insights for the instructor and program leadership
- Maintain confidentiality and accuracy when handling evaluation feedback

## **Student/Administrative Support**

- Monitor and respond to student inquiries via the course Canvas, email, or discussion boards
- Provide clarification on course materials, assignments, and expectations
- Review and grade assignments, quizzes, and discussion board contributions according to provided rubrics
- Assist in maintaining academic rigor and alignment with course learning objectives
- Foster an inclusive and engaging online learning environment

- Background in Nursing, Public Health, addiction management, counseling, or related field
- Experience working within the SoN and UW system
- Experience with online education
- Familiarity with Canvas learning management system
- Experience designing and administering surveys or evaluations in an education context
- Ability to handle sensitive data with discretion and professionalism
- Strong written communication skills
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively as part of a team
- Ability to solve problems creatively
- Demonstrated attention to detail and excellent organizational skills

Requirements: Appointment is governed by a union contract. Non-U.S. citizens hired to perform teaching duties must (1) meet English language proficiency requirements and (2) participate fully in the International Teaching Assistant Program at the Center for Instructional Development and Research (CIDR). Documentation will be requested prior to appointment.
