

Teaching Assistant Position (25% FTE)
NCLIN 306
Autumn, Winter, and Spring 2026-2027

We are recruiting for a Teaching Assistant in the Department of Biobehavioral Nursing & Health Informatics to provide teaching related support for **NCLIN 306: Foundational Skills for Professional Nurses for the 2026-2027 academic year**. This laboratory-based course focuses on psychomotor skills and critical thinking in the context of nursing care to individuals across the lifespan. Patient safety and quality; person-centered care are emphasized through use of simulation. Course Coordinator: Elizabeth Frazier. This position is 10 hours/week (25%).

Teaching Assistant will work with course coordinator to provide assistance and support with teaching duties:

- Supervision of undergraduate nursing students in the laboratory setting.
- Conducting and facilitating pre- and post-clinical seminars.
- Participating in connected teaching meetings with the Course Coordinator.
- Evaluating weekly written and clinical student performance in the laboratory setting relative to course objectives.
- Meetings with the Course Coordinator to review the course materials prior to the start of the quarter.
- Completing Simulation Center training prior to the start of the quarter.

Job Type, Schedule

Part-time, Temporary

- Instructors needed for Autumn Quarter; Onboarding will begin upon hire.
- There are two half-days in the skills laboratory: Mondays from 7:00 am – 12:20 pm and Tuesdays 7:00 am – 12:20 pm.

Requirements

- Master's degree in nursing with a minimum of 2 years' experience working as a RN
- Experience in medical surgical nursing of adults.
- Position contingent on RN licensure in WA State.
- Prior teaching experience preferred.

Duration: The academic year 2026-2027 dates of employment are September 16, 2026 - June 15, 2027. Exact dates and hours of employment will be arranged between the TA and course faculty each quarter.

- Non-U.S. citizens hired to perform teaching duties must (1) meet English language proficiency requirements and (2) participate fully in the International Teaching Assistant Program at the Center for Instructional Development and Research (CIDR). Documentation will be requested prior to appointment.

- **Tuition-based students** who are hired as ASEs (TAs/RAs/SAs) in the UW School of Nursing, receive a resident operating and tech fee waiver, and a waiver of the non-resident differential, if any, in the amount of the current tuition. This is the standard university practice.
